All are equal before law</li> <li>7. No one shall be subjected to arbitrary arrest, detention or exile.</li> <li>8. Everyone accused of a crime in a court of law is presumed innocent until proved guilty in a public trial in which they have rights to deend themselves.</li> <li>9.
