Reading with Young Children



ROUTINE

Build a routine where you can set aside a book time for 10-15 minutes each day.



TOGETHER

Snuggle up close together so your child can see both your face and the book easily.



ENCOURAGE

Encourage your child to hold the book and turn the pages with you.



WATCH AND WAIT

Watch and wait to see what your child likes on each page. Repeat and expand on their ideas.



DESCRIBE

You do not have to stick with the text in the book.

Describe what is happening in the pictures at a level your child will understand.



EMPHASISE

Use clear language with lots of interesting tone in your voice. Emphasise new words and phrases. This will help your child pay attention to the book.



ASK QUESTIONS

Ask questions that will focus your child and stretch their imagination 'I wonder what will happen next?' Pause for a response.



CHAT

Chat and connect the information on the page to your child's own experiences.
