Dear Parents,

Greetings from Saint Mary's. We continue to ask all of our Marian family to hold the school community in prayer especially for the health and safety of our children and their extended families. We pray in a special way for those families that are facing many challenges with health and other difficulties related because of the Pandemic and we trust that peaceful healing and happier times return to one and all. Please read these important updates as we move into week thirty nine of this Academic Year.

CIRCULAR ON RULES, REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES FOR THE FINAL EXAMINATIONS: Parents are requested to carefully go through the circular that explains the rules, regulations and procedures for examinations. This circular has been issued on 6th May 2021.

CIRCULAR ON RULES, REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES FOR THE GL EXAMINATIONS: Parents are requested to carefully go through the circular that explains the rules, regulations and procedures for GL examinations. This circular was issued on 4th May 2021.

TRAVEL DECLARATION: In order for the school to be compliant with the UAE Covid-19 travel requirements, please click on the official DHA link (available on website) and answer the relevant questions even if your child has not travelled. We appreciate if you are not travelling that you complete it as soon as possible. If you are travelling, please complete it prior to your child's return to lessons. The email required to be filled in the field on the form is traveldecl-smchs@smgeducation.org

NEW DHA REQUIREMENTS FOR REPORTING COVID-19 SCHOOL CASES: Even if a child who has opted for Distance Learning / Blended Learning has tested positive for Covid-19, parents are requested to please access the link provided on the school website as per new DHA

requirements and fill it up without fail. The new requirements necessitate that the PCR test report is sent by parents to the school on the same day that they receive it from the lab. **THIS IS NOW MANDATORY FOR PARENTS AS PER DHA. THIS IS ONLY FOR NEW COVID-19 POSITIVE CASES AND NOT THOSE WHO HAVE RECOVERED FROM COVID.**

RETURN FOR THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-2022 : It is that time of the year when we need to request parents to inform us if your child will be returning for the next Academic Year 2021-2022 and we have provided you with a form which also clearly states the criteria for re-registration. We have included the criteria in this circular as well.

CRITERIA FOR RE-REGISTERING YOUR CHILD FOR THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-2022

- 1) There should **not be any OUTSTANDING FEES** for the current Academic Year 2020-2021. In case you re-register your child by error but still have outstanding fees, then the AED 500/- which is the re-registration amount will be adjusted towards the OUTSTANDING FEE and **WILL NOT** be considered as a RE-REGISTRATION AMOUNT. In addition, students who have OUTSTANDING AMOUNTS by the end of this year will automatically not be re-registered for the next Academic Year. We strongly urge ALL parents who still have Outstanding Fees to clear these without any further delay.
- 2) Please be informed that even though the KHDA sends out the Parent-School Contract to all parents by default via email, it will not be considered binding even if you sign it, if you still have outstanding fees for your ward.
- 3) Parents will have to pay AED 500/- as a RE-REGISTRATION AMOUNT that will be adjusted with your child's FIRST TERM FEE for the next Academic Year 2021-2022. This amount has to be paid via the SKIPLY APP from the 26th of APRIL 2021 with a FINAL DEADLINE of 15th MAY 2021.
- 4) Please note that once you re-register your child and pay the re-registration amount but then wish to cancel the same, the amount of AED 500/- shall not be refundable.
- 5) Parents who respond that they are not re-registering their child for the next Academic Year 2021-2022 MUST fill out the attached form to apply for a Leaving Certificate that will be issued at the end of this Academic Year.
- 6) For parents who do not fill out the form by 15th May, 2021, we will consider it as a case of non registration for the next Academic Year 2021-2022.
- 7) Kindly fill out this form and scan it and email it back to your child's class teacher along with the scanned SKIPLY receipt for payment of the re-registration amount of AED 500/-.

THE FINAL DEADLINE FOR RE-REGISTRATION WAS 15TH MAY 2021. WE WILL NOW CONSIDER THAT WHERE RE-REGISTRATION FEES HAVE NOT BEEN PAID THAT THOSE CHILDREN WILL NOT RETURN FOR THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-2022 AS WE HAVE TO CONFIRM OUR NEW ADMISSIONS FOR THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR. PLEASE TREAT THIS WEEKEND AS THE ABSOLUTE FINAL DEADLINE FOR THE PAYMENT OF OUTSTANDING FEES AND RE-REGISTRATION FEES. We will be proceeding with new admissions from the following week based on those who have not been re-registered.

RELEASE OF MID-TERM ASSESSMENTS : The mid-term assessments and mid-term reports have been released to students so that parents may view the same. We have not been able to release the assessments and reports for those students who have any outstanding fees and we would like to remind those parents to kindly settle **ALL OUTSTANDING FEES** without any further delay. Please also be informed that when fees are paid , the assessments will be released only at the weekends as these processes are not automatic and there are several factors involved.

OUTSTANDING FEES FOR THIS ACADEMIC YEAR : We are at a time junction of having gone past ALL DEADLINES for fee payments but we still have a large number of students with outstanding fees. We are urging all parents who have not yet cleared these outstanding fees to do so IMMEDIATELY. Please note that we will not be in a position to provide examination marks, report cards, mid term assessment scripts, reference letters or any other official documents to students who still have outstanding fees. ALL OUTSTANDING FEES MUST BE PAID WITHOUT FURTHER DELAY. RE-REGISTRATION FOR NEXT YEAR CANNOT BE DONE IF THERE ARE ANY OUTSTANDING FEES. We are grateful to those parents who have paid their outstanding fees and we would like to strongly remind those who have not settled these outstanding fees that as per the regulator policy we will have no choice but to shortly disconnect lessons for fee defaulters.

CHOICE OF SUBJECTS FOR YEAR 9 FOR THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR (CURRENT YEAR 8 STUDENTS) : It is that time of the year when we would ask you to reflect with your

children on their subject choices for the next academic year. We are providing you with the options in this circular so that children may begin thinking about their choices and you as parents could seek information from professionals or relatives about onward subject pathways or career paths. We will of course be having an orientation for the students after the Final Exams but the final choices must be made on an official form that we will provide no later than the 8th of June 2021.

SUBJECTS FOR YEAR NINE

- 1. ENGLISH LANGUAGE COMPULSORY
- 2. MATHEMATICS COMPULSORY
- 3. RELIGIOUS STUDIES COMPULSORY for students who take Bible and Islamic Studies
- 4. PSYCHOLOGY COMPULSORY for students who don't take Bible or Islamic Studies
- 5. ARABIC COMPULSORY
- 6. ICT or COMPUTER SCIENCE COMPULSORY
- 7. BIOLOGY <u>OR</u> ACCOUNTS
- 8. CHEMISTRY **OR** ECONOMICS
- 9. PHYSICS OR BUSINESS STUDIES
- 10. ART, ENGLISH LITERATURE, HISTORY, **<u>OR</u>** PSYCHOLOGY- (only 1)

EVERY STUDENT MUST COMPULSORILY CHOOSE ONE SCIENCE SUBJECT IN THEIR OVERALL SELECTION.

Students are asked to consider carefully the options before making their choice.

*** Please note that ICT and one Science have been made compulsory to further closely align with the British Curriculum, as pointed out in our KHDA inspection process over the last few years with a view to furthering students access to technology, thus arming them with the requisite 21st Century skills.

*** Please note that students who do not take Bible or Islamic studies will have Psychology instead of the Religious studies component and therefore these students must choose another subject other than Psychology in OPTION 10.

<u>Islamic Studies and Bible are compulsory for students who take these</u> <u>subjects.</u>

Once the choice has been made a subject CANNOT be changed.

COMPUTER SCIENCE: <u>Kindly note that places for Computer Science will be</u> <u>restricted to those students who currently display a secure</u> <u>understanding and application of computational thinking and problem</u> <u>solving skills.</u> Programming skills are a core component of this course and students will be required to have a knowledge of Python and be competent at designing, writing and debugging programmes . In case the places are oversubscribed, the school will allot seats strictly on the basis of current academic competence in ICT.

Parents may consult with your child's current subject teachers via email if you have any doubts about your child's competence in a particular subject. Ms. Amy Kuriyan is also available via email with regard to any queries about university requirements.

SOCIAL STUDIES BOOK 3 FROM MOE AVAILABLE FOR COLLECTION FROM IRIS INTERNATIONAL: Parents who had paid for and ordered MOE Social Studies text books are hereby informed that Book 3 was just released by the MOE and is available for collection from our book distributors. Please use the link on the school website to make an appointment for collection.

FINAL EXAMINATION PORTIONS and TIMETABLES : The portions for the final examinations have been uploaded under the relevant Department categories on the school website and the Final examination time tables have also been uploaded on the website before the Spring Break Please note that some GL examinations will be scheduled in early June 2021 as the window for these is until 17th June 2021. The time tables have also been attached to the circular of today on the rules, regulations and procedures for Final Examinations.

YEAR 11 AND 13 GRADING ARRANGEMENTS AND EXAMINATION POLICY: Parents are reminded to please check the circular that was sent about grading arrangements for Year 11 and 13 on the 27th of April 2021. We have also uploaded a more detailed Examination Policy in this regard and we had sent it to the SIMS Parent Apps earlier this week.

CONTINUATION OF LESSONS FOR YEARS 11 AND 13: Please note that lessons for years 11 and 13 will continue and relevant content will be covered with students which is meaningful for the next phase in their educational journey. We have created a balance of synchronous and asynchronous lessons to help students better develop skills in research, debates, investigations and

other related life skills that will be crucial as they move onto university. We will also be covering some topics and content from Year 12 with students from Year 11.

VIEWING OF MOCK EXAMINATION ANSWER SCRIPTS FOR YEAR 11 AND 13: We

will be organising the viewing of Mock Examination Answer scripts for students of Year 11 and 13 during the period from Monday, 24th May when the rest of the school has Final Exams. A more detailed time table for the same will be provided on the website by Saturday evening keeping in mind the health and safety protocols.

SOCIAL MEDIA NOT RECOMMENDED FOR PRIMARY CHILDREN : Parents are requested to kindly make sure that Primary Children are not using Social Media as they are well below the statutory age to hold these accounts. We have also noticed that many children as young as Year 4 have their own whatsapp accounts and we at St. Mary's highly discourage this practice as the children are not mature enough to handle these and often wind up in difficult conversations with their peers that might cause potential problems for parents if these are flagged to any local authority for their impropriety.

SOCIAL MEDIA FREQUENT CHECKS BY PARENTS FOR SECONDARY CHILDREN :

Parents of secondary children are strongly encouraged to kindly make frequent checks of your child's use of Social Media. We have seen in many cases that minor children are being sought out on Instagram, Snapchat and other platforms by much older individuals for chats and conversations. It is important for parents to know who their children are conversing with to protect them from any potential safeguarding issues. We would also like to remind parents about your children's use of inappropriate content and language on Social Media Platforms which you will be aware of only if you make frequent checks of the same. Please have your child remove himself/herself from private social media groups that are not encouraged or recommended by us at St. Mary's. The school cannot take responsibility for private groups started by students and we strongly discourage the formation of these groups as well as discourage student participation in them. It is once again important here that ALL PARENTS check your children's digital activity frequently including group activity if your child is part of private groups created by students.

ADMISSION FORMS FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-2022: We would like to inform all parents that admissions to the Academic Year 2021-2022 are now closed. There will be NO ADMISSIONS FOR YEAR ELEVEN. Kindly check the school website www.stmarysdubai.com for the admissions notice for further information related to admissions.

ADMISSION TO YEAR 12 FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-2022 –PARENTS OF YEAR 11 STUDENTS: (This was shared in the circular of 19th September 2020 as well as in all circulars from 11th February 2021, and is being shared again since there are many queries regarding admissions to A-Level)

We would also like to bring to your attention that under the British system, a student completes high school with the completion of his/her O-Level. **Hence the admission to A-Level is then a process of a 'NEW ADMISSION'.**

We would like to point out very clearly , that admission to A-Level is not automatic.

The conditions for a student to be considered for a place in A-Levels are as follows.

• SHOULD HAVE AN EXCELLENT BEHAVIOURAL RECORD

- Must opt for 4 subjects with a high grade average in the subjects opted for.
- Admission will be merit-based.
- Hold a high grade average in ALL SUBJECTS (Internal Exams) in Year 11
- Should have not had any serious or repeated disciplinary issues over Years Nine through Eleven.
- Should not have engaged in activities, in or out of school, which tarnish the reputation of the school.
- Hold a minimum attendance record of 95%
- Be prepared for an entrance exam in the subject opted for that has not been taken at O-Level.

Please check the school website shortly for admission forms to A-Level.

STRONG PASSWORD TO BE SET FOR SCHOOL EMAIL ID & NO SHARING OF PASSWORD WITH OTHER STUDENTS: It is imperative that parents of students (especially years 4-8) ensure that your child has set a strong password for his/ her school email. Moreover we have observed that many students are sharing their passwords with their classmates and we would like you as parents to remind them that this is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN. Please explain to them the potential issues they could face if they share their email passwords with friends/ classmates.

Dear Parents,

Greetings from Saint Mary's. We would like you to go through this circular very carefully so that you are well aware of the rules, regulations and procedures associated with examinations. Please carefully go through the Final Examination Timetable attached to this circular.

FINAL TERM EXAMINATIONS 16TH TO 31st MAY 2021 (including some extended dates in JUNE 2021 for GL exams): We had uploaded the Final Examination Time Table to the school website at the start of the Spring Break and have attached the same to this circular. Please read on about further information related to examinations.

Years 1-3:

For subjects on the Examination Timetable and PSHE which is on the 6th of May, we will use Google Forms and the duration of each exam has been indicated in the Examination Timetable. For Music Art and Sports, a simple task will be sent this weekend and the **FINAL SUBMISSION DATE IS THE 2ND OF JUNE 2021**. Tasks can be submitted even before this date. Kindly make sure that it is the children only who are working on these tasks keeping in mind the school's Academic Integrity Policy. Please ensure that your child has a digital device (laptop/ desktop/ tablet) that is in good working condition for the exams. The class teachers will be organizing a virtual information session for parents to go through the procedures for the examinations.

Year 4 :

For subjects on the Examination Timetable and PSHE which is on the 6th of May, we will use Google Forms and the duration of each exam has been indicated in the Examination Timetable. For Music Art and Sports, a simple task will be sent this weekend and the **FINAL SUBMISSION DATE IS THE 2ND OF JUNE 2021**. Tasks can be submitted even before this date. Kindly make sure that it is the children only who are working on these tasks keeping in mind the school's Academic Integrity Policy. **Please ensure that your child has a digital device (laptop/ desktop/ tablet) that is in good working condition for the exams.**

Years 5 & 6:

For subjects on the Examination Timetable we will use Google Forms and the duration of each exam has been indicated in the Examination Timetable. The Art exam has been scheduled for the 6th of May 2021. Please ensure that your child has a digital device (laptop/ desktop/ tablet) that is in good working condition for the exams.

Years 7 through 13:

For secondary school we will not be using Google Forms but students will receive their examination question paper and they will be required to write the answers just as they would on ruled paper sheets and scan it as a PDF document and send it to a specially created GOOGLE CLASSROOM for Examinations. There will be a separate time allocated after the exam for students to scan and post their answer scripts. Full details of the process can be found below.

It is imperative that children have a good supply of good quality A4 size ruled paper and a digital device that works well so as not to hamper their work. Please ensure that you have a good and stable Wifi connection for the examinations. A desktop or laptop is preferable to a tablet.

PROCESS TO BE FOLLOWED FOR THE FINAL EXAMINATIONS:

For the smooth conduct of the exam we request you to ensure that the following points are taken care of

- 1) Check the device that your child is using well in advance and ensure that it does not have any hardware or software issues.
- 2) The CAMERA and MICROPHONE MUST be in good working condition.
- 3) Kindly ensure that an uninterrupted WI-Fi network is provided for your child.
- 4) It is MANDATORY to switch on the device camera for the duration of the exam. Answer Scripts will not be evaluated if the camera is not switched on.
- 5) Students must only use the **RAISE THE HAND OPTION** if they have a doubt.
- 6) Class teachers will schedule the Zoom call for 8:00 am and take attendance. For years 4, 5 and 6 the link for exams will be sent to their school email ID. Class teachers will monitor them while they take the exam. For years 7 to 10 and 12 a special Google Classroom for Exams had been created in the first term and the papers will be posted there. The start time of ALL MORNING SESSIONS will be 8:20 am and teachers will inform students daily about the end time as paper durations will differ across subjects.
- 7) Year 4, 5 and 6 students may submit the Google form once they have completed but must remain present in silence until ALL exams have been submitted and the teachers have checked that they have been successfully received.

- 8) Students from years 7 through 10 and 12 will be given 15 minutes at the end of each exam to scan the answer sheets. Answer sheets MUST be scanned using a good quality mobile scanner/ regular scanner in pdf format & be turned in to the special Google Classroom for exams. In case of any technical difficulty they must contact the class teacher immediately for further instructions.
- 9) Answer script files should be named as Student name_Subject_Class/Section (Danielle_Physics_11A)
- 10) Answer scripts that have not been turned in within the 15 minute window provided for this purpose will not be evaluated.
- 11) Students who experience a Wifi disruption will be asked to come to school to take the exam & therefore it is imperative that parents do their best to ensure a stable Wifi connection.
- 12) Only A4 sized ruled sheets must be used for answering examinations.
- 13) Where the number of lines have been specified for answers, then only those number of lines must be used to answer. This is to help students prepare for Board Examination requirements.
- 14) Students will not have lessons after the morning examination as per the regular Final Examination Schedule that we have every year.

Academic honesty is a fundamental part of learning and teaching and a core value of Saint Mary's Catholic High School Dubai.

While we understand that children are in your physical space during these assessments we also know and trust that parents are the first teachers of values to their children. We therefore request you to only facilitate or help with the technological aspect of the assessment administration if needed but to refrain from assisting in any way with the content of the assessment. We know that above all else both parents and teachers want the values of honesty and integrity to be deeply embedded in the children as key drivers for their journey through life. Children watch us very closely and look up to us as role models and we want them to know that they can continue to maintain these values even when they are doing an assessment at home.

For older children, we recommend that you have a conversation with them about the school's clear expectations for 'Academic Honesty' and that they must not resort to any unfair means while doing their assessments. They must not resort to any kind of malpractice during the examinations.

ATTENDANCE FOR THESE EXAMINATIONS IS CRITICAL AND WE URGE YOU TO SPEAK TO YOUR CHILDREN ABOUT NOT TAKING THESE LIGHTLY. WE WILL NOT BE IN A POSITION TO CREDIT OR

MARK ASSESSMENTS THAT HAVE NOT BEEN DONE OR THAT ARE TURNED IN LATE.

If a child is sick please send an email with the attached medical certificate as evidence to Lise-Ann. <u>l.pinto-smchs@smgeducation.org</u>. Kindly mention your child's full name and section and the exam/s missed in your email to her.

As part of the Academic Honesty and Integrity students MUST NOT EVER UNSUBMIT any assessment submitted in Google Classroom for editing purposes. Teachers get a notification when a student UNSUBMITS a document and NO MARKS will be given in this case.

<u>Please explain to your children very carefully that should there be any doubt</u> <u>that unfair means of any kind were used while answering any of the</u> <u>assessments then the school reserves the right to require the student to re-</u> <u>take the entire series of assessments on the premises.</u> <u>The school will also</u> <u>analyse past attainment and progress of every student in ascertaining that</u> <u>academic integrity has been rigorously maintained by the student in</u> <u>answering these examinations.</u>

We have always held the students of St. Mary's in high esteem as far as their integrity and respect for the Marian Values is concerned and we would like to remind them that these values must be the cornerstone while they take their Final Examinations.

We would like to wish the children all the very best for their examinations and we hope that they will do their very best and above all be sincere and honest when answering their examinations.
