Rhythm and pace can also be used in sentences, often through sentence length and structure. Writers use sentence length and structure to create different rhythms to help to convey the meaning and mood of their text.

This time he is underwater, running, feet sinking deeper and deeper into the bed. The surface is within his reach if he raises his arms, but he can't get his head out of the water. • The sentence structure mimics Flip's quick movements.

dignityo, in fair verona,

- The sentences are long, building up the pace and reflecting Flip's growing anxiety as he struggles to free himself.
- Use of connective 'and' shows how he is situation is worsening 'deeper and deeper' as does connective 'but': 'but he can't get his head out of the water.'
