

## YEAR 7 – FIRST TERM EXAMINATION 2021

### **GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:**

#### Prepare your workspace:

- ✦ You want to make sure you have a clean workspace.
- ✦ Choose an area with plenty of natural light and a table, chair. Lay down newspaper on your work area to keep it clean.

#### Gather your remaining materials:

- ✦ To create your artwork, you'll need different brushes, containers of water to wash and rinse your brush, water colors, palette a sketchpad paper and plenty of inspiration.
- ✦ Make sure you have a pencil and eraser to make your sketches for the sea scene and water colors for the entire artwork.

### **ARTWORK INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. Decide on a sea scene (the water, sky, any boats or objects in the scene as well as what time of day you are portraying) as your artwork.
2. Lightly sketch the sea scene; all the aspects of your chosen scene in pencil onto your sketchpad paper: This will be the guide for your painting. Once you have a sketch of the completed sea scene, you will begin to paint the sea scene with lines.
3. Choose your colors for the sea scene; this includes different blues for the sea and sky alongside different colors for any objects such as boats in your painting. Remember what part of the day your scene is in which directs you to understand different colors that will be depicted in your artwork.
4. You have to create the entire artwork with painted lines. Take your paint brush and begin to paint the outlines of your drawing, then continue painting lines in between the painted outlines. Blend the different colors together on the page so there is a nice transition between the different colors. Make sure the lines are clearly evident and distinctly visible.
5. Take a picture of your artwork and turn it in the Art exam.

Remember: You have to paint using a single line that never touches or crosses itself. While painting take care to move your paintbrush around the areas in a back and forth motion.

Tip: Use the tip of the brush and have the right consistency of paint to pull your maze lines along the paper. You need to remember that you pull your paint brush, not scrub with it. And you need to add a bit of water to the pan of color and gently wiggle the brush to loosen the paint, not mash it into the pan!
