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Students must be informed that they will be shown a short video. While watching, they will have to make note of how the presenter engages the audience.

Play a 5 minute video of a Travel Talk – RICK STEVE'S – WEST ENGLAND

Students may then be put in to groups to discuss and list all the techniques the presenter has used. (5 minutes)

This is then shared by one member from each group, with the whole class. (10mins)

Students may then be shown the clip once again for them to make any additional points they may have missed out on.
