Dear Parents,

Greetings from Saint Mary's. We continue to ask all of our Marian family to hold the school community in prayer especially for the health and safety of our children and their extended families. We pray in a special way for those families that are facing many challenges with health and other difficulties related because of the Pandemic and we trust that peaceful healing and happier times return to one and all. Please read these important updates as we move into week forty two of this Academic Year.

RETURN FOR THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-2022 :

THE FINAL DEADLINE FOR RE-REGISTRATION WAS 15TH MAY 2021. WE WILL NOW CONSIDER THAT WHERE RE-REGISTRATION FEES HAVE NOT BEEN PAID THAT THOSE CHILDREN WILL NOT RETURN FOR THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-2022 AS WE HAVE TO CONFIRM OUR NEW ADMISSIONS FOR THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR. We will NOW be proceeding with new admissions based on those who have not been re-registered.

OUTSTANDING FEES FOR THIS ACADEMIC YEAR :

We are now in the last month of this Academic Year and have gone past ALL DEADLINES for fee payments but disappointingly we still have a large number of students with outstanding fees. Please note that we will not be in a position to provide examination marks, report cards, mid-term assessment scripts, reference letters, leaving certificates or any other official documents to students who still have outstanding fees. ALL OUTSTANDING FEES MUST BE PAID WITHOUT FURTHER DELAY. RE-REGISTRATION FOR NEXT YEAR CANNOT BE DONE IF THERE ARE ANY OUTSTANDING FEES.

We would like to strongly remind those parents who have not settled these outstanding fees that their children will also not have a place for the next Academic Year 2021-2022. Students in Year 11 and 13 with outstanding fees will not have their Pearson Edexcel results released until all outstanding fees have been settled.

NEW DHA REQUIREMENTS FOR REPORTING COVID-19 SCHOOL CASES:

Even if a child who has opted for Distance Learning / Blended Learning has tested positive for Covid-19, parents are requested to please access the link provided on the school website as per new DHA requirements and fill it up without fail. The new requirements necessitate that the PCR test report is sent by parents to the school on the same day that they receive it from the lab. **THIS IS NOW MANDATORY FOR PARENTS AS PER DHA. THIS IS ONLY FOR NEW COVID-19 POSITIVE CASES AND NOT THOSE WHO HAVE RECOVERED FROM COVID.**

BOOK LISTS FOR NEXT YEAR:

The book lists for next year will be sent to you shortly along with the process for ordering books for the next Academic Year. A detailed circular for this purpose will also be issued in the coming week. Please be informed that ALL TIMELINES must be respected as books are shipped from the UK.

RELEASE OF FINAL EXAMINATION ANSWER SCRIPTS :

The FINAL EXAMINATION ANSWER SCRIPTS/FORMS have been released from the 6th of June 2021 onwards to students so that students and parents may view the same. **We will not be releasing these to any students who still have OUTSTANDING FEES with the school.**

CHOICE OF SUBJECTS FOR YEAR 9 FOR THE NEXT ACADEMIC YEAR (CURRENT YEAR 8 STUDENTS) :

A few students had sent in incomplete forms or forms that were not fully readable and therefore individual class teachers will be contacting those students regarding re-submission of these forms.

VERY IMPORTANT REQUIREMENT FOR THE CLINIC YEAR 9 AND 10 GIRLS :

Parents of girls in Years nine and ten are requested to urgently fill out the form regarding information about the Human Papilloma Vaccine (HPV) status for your child. This is a mandatory form to be filled in for DHA records and must be done without any delay. The form is available on the school website and will also be sent to you by the class teachers via the class group email.

REGULAR LESSONS FOR ALL YEAR GROUPS UNTIL THE 29TH OF JUNE 2021:

We would like all parents to be aware that regular lessons will continue through the month of June and attendance is mandatory .

For **Years 1-8**- Core subjects (English, Math, Arabic and Science)will focus on covering those critical gaps in learning so that we can optimize learning outcomes and ensure that students transition with limited challenges into the next year.

YEARS 9-12- Teachers will chose key content from the next Year to begin working with. Please be informed that the content/ topics/ modules will not be repeated in the following year. Teachers will also cover KEY GAPS in learning simultaneously so as to avoid an academic struggle next year.

YEAR 13- Teachers will be covering key skills that students will require for their first year at university with a large focus on research skills as well as insightful information on the consequences of plagiarism. We will also be covering a host of themes associated with the Expo 2020 for ALL CLASSES as this is going to be a major area of focus for the education sector for the next Academic Year.

In addition we will be having celebration days for the students related to culture and environmental awareness with a view to larger student engagement.

SOCIAL STUDIES BOOK 3 FROM MOE AVAILABLE FOR COLLECTION FROM IRIS INTERNATIONAL:

Parents who had paid for and ordered MOE Social Studies text books are hereby informed that Book 3 was just released by the MOE and is available for collection from our book distributors. Please use the link on the school website to make an appointment for collection.

YEAR 11 AND 13 GRADING ARRANGEMENTS AND EXAMINATION POLICY:

Parents are reminded to please check the circular that was sent about grading arrangements for Year 11 and 13 on the 27th of April 2021. We have also uploaded a more detailed Examination Policy in this regard and we had sent it to the SIMS Parent Apps earlier this week.

VIEWING OF MOCK EXAMINATION ANSWER SCRIPTS FOR YEARS 11 AND 13:

We had organised the viewing of Mock Examination answer scripts for students of years 11 and 13 last week. Students who do not have any outstanding dues and were not able to make it last week may come to school on Tuesday, 8th June 2021 for this purpose. This will be the last date available for papers to be viewed. Those students who are going to come to school for this purpose must inform your class teachers by Sunday, 6th June at the latest.

YEAR 13 MOCK EXAMINATION REPORT CARDS:

Mock Examination Report cards have been published on the SIMS Parent App and are available for viewing. **We will not publish report cards for students with outstanding dues.**

SOCIAL MEDIA NOT RECOMMENDED FOR PRIMARY CHILDREN :

Parents are requested to kindly make sure that Primary Children are not using Social Media as they are well below the statutory age to hold these accounts. We have also noticed that many children as young as Year 4 have their own whatsapp accounts and we at St. Mary's highly discourage this practice as the children are not mature enough to handle these and often wind up in difficult conversations with their peers that might cause potential problems for parents if these are flagged to any local authority for their impropriety.

SOCIAL MEDIA FREQUENT CHECKS BY PARENTS FOR SECONDARY CHILDREN:

Parents of secondary children are strongly encouraged to kindly make frequent checks of your child's use of Social Media. We have seen in many cases that minor children are being sought out on Instagram, Snapchat and other platforms by much older individuals for chats and conversations. It is important for parents to know who their children are conversing with to protect them from any potential safeguarding issues. We would also like to remind parents about your children's use of inappropriate content and language on Social Media Platforms which you will be aware of only if you make frequent checks of the same. Please have your child remove himself/herself from private social media groups that are not encouraged or recommended by us at St. Mary's. The school cannot take responsibility for private groups started by students and we strongly discourage the formation of these groups as well as discourage student participation in them. It is once again important here that ALL PARENTS check your children's digital activity frequently including group activity if your child is part of private groups created by students.

ADMISSION TO YEAR 12 FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2021-2022 –PARENTS OF YEAR 11 STUDENTS:

(This was shared in the circular of 19th September 2020 as well as in all circulars from 11th February 2021, and is being shared again since there are many queries regarding admissions to A-Level)

We would also like to bring to your attention that under the British system, a student completes high school with the completion of his/her O-Level. **Hence the admission to A-Level is then a process of a 'NEW ADMISSION'. We would like to point out very clearly , that admission to A-Level is not automatic.**

The conditions for a student to be considered for a place in A-Levels are as follows.

- **SHOULD HAVE AN EXCELLENT BEHAVIOURAL RECORD**
- Must opt for 4 subjects with a high grade average in the subjects opted for.
- Admission will be merit-based.
- Hold a high grade average in ALL SUBJECTS (Internal Exams) in Year 11
- Should have not had any serious or repeated disciplinary issues over Years Nine through Eleven.
- Should not have engaged in activities, in or out of school, which tarnish the reputation of the school.
- **Hold a minimum attendance record of 95%**
- **Be prepared for an entrance exam in the subject opted for that has not been taken at O-Level.**

Please check the school website shortly for admission forms to A-Level.

If any student or parent finds any unusual activity happening with your school email ID, kindly forward the same to IT support on their email and they will look into the matter immediately.

STRONG PASSWORD TO BE SET FOR SCHOOL EMAIL ID & NO SHARING OF PASSWORD WITH OTHER STUDENTS:

It is imperative that parents of students (especially years 4-8) ensure that your child has set a strong password for his/ her school email. Moreover we have observed that many students are sharing their passwords with their classmates and we would like you as parents to remind them that this is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN. Please explain to them the potential issues they could face if they share their email passwords with friends/ classmates.

TRAVEL DECLARATION:

In order for the school to be compliant with the UAE Covid-19 travel requirements, please click on the official DHA link (available on website) and answer the relevant questions even if your child has not travelled. We appreciate if you are not travelling that you complete it as soon as possible. If you are travelling, please complete it prior to your child's return to lessons.
