YEAR 6 ENGLISH LANGUAGE PORTION FOR FIRST TERM EXAM - JANUARY 2024

Students will be assessed for reading comprehension, spelling, grammatical awareness, and creative writing skills.

<u>Reading:</u> Comprehension questions will be set on an extract from an unseen story and an unseen non-fiction text.

Questions will focus on:

- Identifying and retrieving key words, phrases, ideas, information about setting, events, characters from texts
- Differentiation between fact and opinion
- Deducing and inferring meanings of words, phrases, ideas, information, character's actions, thoughts and feelings with evidence from texts
- Identifying and explaining presentational features, language features, punctuation, figures of speech, atmosphere, mood and tone in texts
- Identifying audience/purpose of texts
- Sequencing ideas, events in the correct order.
- Summarizing key ideas

Writing: Questions will focus on spellings, grammar, and creative writing.

A. Spellings of words, and paragraph dictation

B. Grammar:

- Word Class
- Adverbials
- Modal verbs
- Formal and Informal Language
- Tense(present tense/ past tense)
- Apostrophes
- Use of commas and hyphens to clarify meaning or avoid ambiguity in writing
- Relative pronouns and relative clauses

C. Creative Writing question will focus on:

Questions on prose will assess the students' knowledge, understanding and their responses to the stories through a range of questions: multiple choice; short answer and long answer questions.

The questions will focus on:

- Significant events and situations in the story
- Description of characters, setting, points of view
- Interpretation of imagery and themes
- Exploration of features of the stories, story openings and endings, plot development, significance of events, character development, humor, themes, writer's use of language and style, writer's teachnique, character's reaction to events/situations and interactions between characters.
- Matching events, characters, situations, themes, dialogues
- Sequencing of and description of important events and situations
- Students' response to the stories –characters, events, situations, setting, plot, themes, point of view, writer's style, writing in role.

Marks will be given for accurate use of grammar, spelling and punctuation.

Poetry Questions will be set on one or two poems taught in Term 1.

 - f) alliteration
- Understanding and commenting on 'surface' and 'hidden' meanings
- Explanation of form and structure of the poems
- Explanation of poets' use of language to create images, descriptive and narrative effects
- Personal responses and preferences with evidence and explanation

- Reading novels/poems strengthens your critical thinking, builds vocabulary and improves the quality of your answers.
- Must re-read the novel, at least three times, carefully and critically with close reference to the focus of questions stated in the Portion.
- Read the collection of poems in your Poetry text with close reference to the focus of questions stated in the Portion. Write your thoughts, feelings, your likes and dislikes with evidence from the poems. Discuss your reasons and views.


